**By region** (from North to South) these would be the places we (SAT Chile) most sell to our different markets:

### The North and The Atacama Desert

- The Lauca National Park – Lake Chungara: UNESCO World Biosphere Reserve.
- San Pedro de Atacama: The driest desert of the world, more than 375 natural attractions

### Santiago, Valparaíso and The Central Valleys

- Casablanca: one of the 10 Greatest Wine Capitals of the world.
- Valparaíso's lifts and trolleybuses: living heritage.
- Route of the Poets: Neruda's houses on Negra Island and in Valparaíso, and Vicente Huidobro's house in Cartagena.
- Colchagua Valley: It has been dubbed "The Best Winemaking Region in the World" by the magazine Wine Enthusiast thanks to its world-class reds.

### Lakes and Volcanoes

- Villarrica and Pucon: Thermal Springs Route: a large concentration of thermalsprings in the middle of the country's natural landscape.
- Pucón: an adventure sports paradise, offering kayak, rafting, trekking and volcano climbs

### Puerto Varas and Frutillar

- Puyehue National Park, Vicente Pérez Rosales National Park and Alerce Andino National Park: southern forests and landscapes.
- The Lakes Crossing: navigate along Todos los Santos Lake and make the crossing over to the Argentine city of Bariloche.

### Chiloé

- 16 of Chiloé's traditional churches are UNESCO World Heritage Sites.
- Chiloé National Park: trekking through native forests and along remote beaches.

### Patagonia and Antarctica

- Queulat National Park: beautiful hanging glaciers
- The Marble Chapels: the incredible caverns of General Carrera Lake
- Magdalena Island: premier continental penguin colony in Magallanes
- Majestic glaciers in the Southern and Northern Ice Fields
- Access to Tierra del Fuego, the final border in the extreme south
- Torres del Paine National Park: UNESCO World Biosphere Reserve since 1978
- Antarctic Treasures: whales, killer whales, seals, penguins, elephant seals, Antarctic sea lions, and more

### Easter Island

- Rapa Nui National Park: UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1995
- Moai: more than 900 stone-carved statues
- Transparent waters: ideal for scuba diving and snorkeling
